Sermon Outlines Two Signs of Discipleship

"This man was also with Him Thou art also of them."

Luke 22:56, 58

Those in the High Priest's house recognized Peter by two circumstances: he had been in the company of Jesus, and he had been in the company of Jesus' followers. These two marks on a person's life have always been indications of discipleship, and are the same today. A Christian is one who is united both to Christ and to other Christians. Hence we have a sure but simple test of a true Christian life.

- I. With Christ "with Him" (v. 56)
 - 1. Salvation
 - (a) Our great need in the past.
 - 2. Sanctification
 - (a) Our great need in the present.
 - 3. Satisfaction
 - (a) Our great need for past, present and future.
 - (b) All are found only in Christ.
- II. With Christians "of them" (v. 58)
 - 1. Oneness of life in Christ
 - (a) The Spirit animating.
 - 2. Oneness of Love to Christ
 - (a) The Spirit inspiring
 - 3. Oneness of Labour for Christ
 - (a) The Spirit directing

The New Testament connects the ideas of a church and fellowship. Cf. 1 John 1:3, 6, 7

Conclusion:

- 1. Two simple tests:
 - (a) What is Christ to me?
 - (b) What are my fellow-Christians to me?

If I am not in their company, I must take heed and examine myself.

- 2. Two simple secrets:
 - (a) Abiding in Christ (1 John 2:5, 6)
 - (b) Love to others (1 John 2:10; 3:10)
