Ofttimes when an individual is newly saved they ask someone: "What is the best book to read first?" The normal answer is "the gospel of John". Others would say any of the gospels, some would perhaps say Romans, but few would say Isaiah. Yet, when as a new convert, Augustine asked Ambrose which of the best of the sacred books was best to be studied. The answer was "Isaiah". There is no other Old Testament books that focus so much on the grace of God, redemption, and righteous judgment. Isaiah has been called by several names: "The gospel according to Isaiah", "The fifth Evangelist", and "The prophet of redemption".

3) The clause "I will"

This expression is found in 114 verses, but not all of then are declarations of divine sovereignty (ch. 1:15; 13:11). Some are the words of men (ch. 7:12; 8:17), others of Satan typified (ch. 14:14). Some of the delightful ones are:

"I will restore thy judges as at the first"	ch. 1:26	Only found here
"I will fasten him as a a nail in a sure place"	ch. 22:23	Only found here
"Fear not, I will help thee"	ch. 41:13-14	Here and in Ruth 3:11 but there it is as "fear not, I will"
"I will pour water on him that is thirsty"	ch. 44:3	Only found here. The clause "I will pour" occurs 12 other times, most often as "I will pour out" in reference to the Holy Spirit.
"I will make the place of my feet glorious"	ch. 60:13	Only found here
"I will extend peace like a river"	ch. 66:12	Only found here

4) The clause "the day"

Scripture	Reference	
"The day of the Lord"	ch. 2:12; 13:6, 9	Only these references in Isaiah. This expression and "the day of the Lord's" is found in 23 other references. In ch. 34:8 it reads: "The day of the Lord's vengeance"
"The day of His fierce anger"	ch. 13:13	Only found here, and in Lam. 1:12
"The day that the Lord will give thee rest"	ch. 14:3	While the wording "the day that the Lord" it occurs in 9 verses, this is the only reference with the words: "I will give thee rest".
"That day"	These are the references in Isaiah but not all of these refer to the future day of judgment and the reader will need to discern where they belong either in the historical, prophetical or both) (ch. 17:4, 7, 9; 19:16, 18, 19, 21, 23, 24; 20:6; 22:12, 20, 25; 23:15) (The expression "the day" occurs in 368 verses	

5) Other key phrases:

"The whole earth is full of His glory"	ch. 6:3	Only found here but in ch. 14:7 "the whole earth is at rest"; and "The joy of the whole earth" (Psa. 48:2)
"Provoked the Holy One of Israel"	ch. 1:4	Only found here but the clause "The holy One" occurs in 40 verses.
"Highway"	ch. 7:3	The word occurs 7 times in Isaiah, and 8 times in other places
"Zion"	ch. 1:8	Found in 47 verses in Isaiah and 107 times elsewhere: as a "Sion" it occurs in 9 verses
"Pangs of a woman"	ch. 21:3	Only found here
"The mouth of the Lord hath spoken"	ch. 1:20; 40:5; 58:14	Also Jer. 9:12
"The mighty One of Israel"	ch. 1:24; ch. 30:29	Only found in these 2 verses
"The mighty One of Jacob"	ch. 49:26 ch. 60:16	Only found in these 2 verses
"Jacob"	ch. 2:3	Occurs 40 times in Isaiah and 306 times elsewhere
"Redeemer"	ch. 41:14	Occurs 13 times in Isaiah and 6 times elsewhere

"Redeemed"	ch. 1:27	Occurs 13 times in Isaiah and 48 times elsewhere

Kev Verses:

- a) "I have nourished and brought up children, and they have rebelled against me . . . Israel doth not know, my people doth not consider . . . they have forsaken the Lord, they have provoked the Holy One of Israel unto anger, they are gone away backward" (ch. 1:2-4)
- b) "Surely as I have thought, so shall it come to pass, and as I have purposed, so it shall stand . . . For the Lord of hosts hath purposed, and who shall disannul it? and His hand is stretched out, and who shall turn it back?" (ch. 14:24, 27)
- c) "Behold, my servant shall deal prudently, He shall be exalted and extolled, and be very high" (ch. 52:13)
