The Duration of Jeremiah's Ministry

Called upon to speak the word of God in exceedingly dark days of judgment of God. He was not a communicator for God but his heart beat in fellowship with God. In Ezekiel we get the movements of God forensically, but in Jeremiah the grief that was attending that departure.

We are told the "word of the Lord in the days of Josiah . . . In his thirteenth year" (ch. 1:2) and also in the days of Jehoiakim and to the end of the eleventh year of Zedekiah (ch. 1:3) when the children of Israel were take captive. He prophesied throughout the latter 18 years of Josiah's reign, the three months of Johoahaz, the eleven years of Jehoiakim, and the eleven years of Zedekiah's reign. Two matters are interesting: the times God spoke and the durations in which He was silent.
