Introduction

There are many books which are a mine of information. In them we find the "understood" or "accepted" answers to many of the wonders of creation. However, fascinating as these books are, it is only insofar as they have a spiritual perspective they are of eternal value. In contrast with all the books authored by man, the Bible stands distinct. There is no other secular or religious book that can compare with it, for there is no other book which:

- a) Stimulates faith by the case histories of others. (Heb. 11:4-12:3)
- b) Builds character. (Psa. 19:7)
- c) Gives true perspective on the purpose of life and what true life consists of. (1 Cor. 10:31; Rev. 4:11; Lk. 12:15)
- d) Gives the answer to temptation and reveals its origin and progress. (Gen. 3:1-6; Matt. 4:1-11; Jam. 1:15)
- e) Exhorts to hope (assurance) in life's darkest moments. (1 Thess. 4:13-18)
- f) Transforms the life. (2 Cor. 3:18)
- g) Reveals the future. (Dan. 2:36-45; 7:9-27; Rev. chs. 4-22)
- h) Reveals the need, way and results of the gospel of power. (Rom. 1:18-8:39) (especially ch. 1:16-17)
- i) Gives moral profit from its guidance and warnings. (Psa. 119:9)
- j) Spiritual profit is derived from its doctrine and experimental truth. (2 Tim. 3:16)

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3) The Number of Books:

The word Bible simply means the book. It is known as the Holy Bible because it is the Word of the Holy God. Within its pages is the foundational teaching for the Christian faith. Therefore, all that we need to know in this lifetime, relative to God, Christ, the Holy Spirit, salvation, creation, sanctification, and the future is derived completely and exclusively from the Bible. If we were to consider nature, telescopically or microscopically, even though marred by sin it still speaks eloquently of God's glory, power, and other attributes (Rom. 1:20). Wonderful as creation is, it can never bring us to a personal relationship with God, nor can it reveal to us the deep things of God. For such, we need the scriptures which have been made in three stages, revelation, inspiration, and translation. To these must be added compilation, recollection, and enlightenment.

When the Lord spoke to the two people on the Emmaus Road, He spoke saying: "all things must be fulfilled, which were written in the law of Moses, and in the prophets, and in the psalms, concerning me." (Lk. 24:44). That was the threefold division of the Jewish Old Testament books.

- a) The law (called the "Tōrāh") consisted of five books: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy, the same as we have today.
- b) The prophets (called the Nebī'm") contained 8 books which were: Joshua, Judges, Samuel, Kings, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and one book that incorporated all the minor prophets which is Hosea through to Malachi.
- c) The Psalms (called the "Kethūbīm") consisted of 11 books: Psalms, Proverbs, Job, Song of Solomon, Ruth, Lamentations, Ecclesiastics, Esther, Daniel, Ezra, Nehemiah and Chronicles.

The books we have are the same as the ancient Israelites, but instead of one book containing all the minor prophets, we have twelve individual books. The present order was organized in the Septuagint translation and was made in Alexandria by seventy scholars in 285–246. B. C.

4) The men God used to write the scriptures or record their life experiences:

Abraham and Job were both sheiks, David was a shepherd king, Peter was a publican (tax collector), Jonah was a rebellious missionary, Moses was an Egyptian Prince, Amos was a herdsman, Daniel was a diplomat, Paul was an intellect, and Luke was a physician.

- a) The Bible was written by some 40 plus persons over 1600 years
- b) The Bible is divided into 2 major sections: Old Testament (39 books) and the New Testament (27 books)

- c) Lengths:
 - i) The longest book is the Psalms
 - ii) The longest chapter is Psa. 119
 - iii) The longest verse is Est. 8:9
 - iv) The shortest book is 3rd John
 - v) The shortest chapter is Psa. 117
 - vi) The shortest verse is Jn. 11:35
 - vii) The middle chapter is Psa. 117
 - viii)The middle verse is Psa. 118:8, and its truth is eternal: "It is better to trust in the LORD than to put confidence in man".
 - ix) The longest Name is Maher-shalal-hash-baz (18 letters) Isa. 8:1
- d) Books which have no questions:
 - i) Zephaniah, 2 Timothy, Titus, 2nd and 3rd John
- e) Books which have no mention of God:
 - i) Esther and the Song of Solomon
- f) Books named after a woman:
 - i) Ruth and Esther
- g) Books which only have one chapter:
 - i) Obadiah, Philemon, 2nd and 3rd John, Jude
- h) The oldest man in the Bible is Methuselah who lived 969 years
- i) Chapter and verse divisions:
 - i) One opinion is that Cardinal Hugo de S Caro divided the books into chapters in 1238-1240. This is dependent on the testimony of Gilbert Genebrard who died in 1597. However, the more accepted opinion is that Stephen Langton, who was the Archbishop of Canterbury (d. 1228), made the chapter divisions.
 - ii) It seems there were several attempts to divide the Old Testament chapters into verses. The first by Santi Pagnini (1470-1541). Then in 1551 Robert Estienne created an alternate numbering system. This is the division accepted today. The New Testament verse divisions were made by Robertus Stephanus in 1551.
 - iii) The first English New Testament to use the verse divisions was a 1557 translation by William Whittingham (1524-1579).
 - iv) The first complete Bible in English to use both chapters and verses was the published in 1560 called the Geneva Bible.
- j) One verse that starts with the letter "Z"
 - i) "Zion heard and was glad" (Psa. 97:8)

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- The only book written to a woman
 i) 2nd John, to the elect Lady
- There are ten books with over 1000 verses
